- 1. I am an Employer and have my own business can I collaborate with ELT?
 - Yes, as an employer or an HR personnel representing an organization you can:
 - Host an internationally trained professional as a volunteer placement participant
 - Hire an internationally trained professional
 - Access grants and various resources offered to support internationally trained professional
 - Collaborate with a skilled Job Developer to learn step by step process to partner

- 2. What are the eligibility criteria for the ELT program?
 - The full eligibility criteria for ELT can be found here: Enhanced Language Training (ELT)
- 3. I am a Temporary resident (such as foreign student, foreign worker, work visa or visitor visa) and I really want to take the ELT program. Can I join ELT?
 - No, clients must have one of the following status to participate in the ELT program
 - Permanent Residence
 - Convention Refugee (Notice of Decision required, see question 2)
 - Landed immigrant
- 4. I am a refugee claimant. Can I join the ELT program?
 - Yes, only if you have a Notice of Decision
 - For the full details please see the ELT eligibility criteria (see question 2)
- 5. I was sponsored by my spouse and am waiting for my PR Card. Can I join the ELT program?
 - Yes, if you have your Record of Landing (ROL)
 - Yes, if your application for Permanent Resident status is being processed in Canada
 - AND you have been informed by a letter from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada of the initial approval of your application subject to an admissibility assessment
 - This means you have approval-in-principle
- 6. I am a Canadian citizen. Can I join the ELT program?
 - No, because you do not meet the ELT eligibility criteria (see question 2)

- 7. I only want to learn English (ESL). Can I join the ELT program?
 - To learn English, visit: <u>www.esltoronto.ca</u> or <u>www.211toronto.ca</u>
- 8. I have IELTS, CELPIP or I attended adult high school and completed and English credit, can I join ELT?
 - No, you must have a CLB score of 6 or above to join the ELT program
- 9. Do I have to do the CLB assessment? What is CLB assessment?
 - Yes, CLB is mandatory to participate in the ELT program
 - CLB stands for Canada Language Benchmarks. It is a free assessment conducted by the <u>YMCA Language Assessment Centre</u> or <u>Achēv Language Assessment Locations</u>
 - You will be assessed for Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing
 - It is done in person and by appointment only
 - Due to the pandemic, all assessment is currently virtual. We can help you book a virtual CLB assessment appointment
- 10. I do not have experience working in Canada, but I have experience in my home country working in my field, can I join ELT?
 - Yes, if you have at least one of the following:
 - o international experience in your selected industry/sector
 - o international education in your selected industry/sector
 - training in your selected industry/sector
 - For full details please see the ELT eligibility criteria (see question 2)
- 11. I do not know how to write a resume for Canadian job market, and the eligibility requires me to submit my resume. Can I get some help before I submit it to ELT?
 - Yes, we can help you, please email us at eltemployment@tdsb.on.ca
 - You do not need to submit a perfect resume. The goal of the ELT program is to provide training on employability skills and assist with job search strategies needed to succeed in the current job market.
