TDSB Revised School Council Bylaw Template

A special thank you to all schools and School Councils who have been working on their by-laws and patiently waiting to hear back on their draft. Please note that we understand your frustration during this period, and we continue to work to provide you with feedback on your submissions. The system remains down while we work out a few technical glitches.

During the week of May 16, 2022, the office will be following up with all School Councils who submitted draft by-laws with a PDF version of the revised template for review and revision of their draft by-laws. Each School Council Chair will be required to:

- 1. review the revised template to ensure that their draft by-laws reflect the revised template
- 2. share any changes/revisions with School Council for sign-off and approval
- 3. submit by-laws in October 2022 to PCEO using the template
- 4. approve School Council by-laws at a Council meeting by November 25, 2022

School Councils that have not yet submitted a by-law draft to the PCEO or have not yet commenced a process for developing or updating by-laws to reflect the template are also required to:

- 1. share the revised template with the School Council for review and drafting of by-laws
- 2. consult draft by-laws with parents/caregivers
- 3. submit the by-laws template to the PCEO by October 22, 2022
- 4. approve School Council by-laws by November 25, 2022

School Council Social Media Account and Website

The Board has prepared the following guidelines for the School Councils' usage of social media and website.

The School Council may utilize social media (Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, etc.) platforms that will assist in fulfilling its purpose. School Council understands that not all parents/caregivers will be familiar with platforms and will provide ongoing assistance in their use.

School Council Social Media Account and Website:

- Must be approved by the principal or assigned designate
- Clearly identifies itself as belonging to the School Council, eliminating any confusion with the school's** official website/social media accounts
- Be coordinated and managed by the Secretary (recorder) and Chair/Co-Chair(s)/Vice-Chair who will monitor the accounts for any negative, harmful, hateful, and discriminatory comments.
- Be shut down by the Chair/Co-Chair(s)/Vice-Chair and Secretary in consultation with the principal and notification to the School Council if usage breaches TDSB policy and procedures
- Not post any photos, videos, or recordings of staff, parents/caregivers, unless consent is provided
- Ensure that the student media release consent form is signed before posting any photos,
 videos, or recordings of students
- Must adhere to TDSB Advertising and Distribution of Materials policy.
- Adhere to all TDSB policies and procedures including but not limited to anti-spam legislation, school** and Board Code of Conduct, Online Code of Conduct, TDSB Equity, Human Rights Policy, etc.
- Do not compromise the privacy of any parent/caregiver, student, staff, or School Council member
- Do not use as a tool or justification to promote, share, or distribute hate information or material
- Be respectful of all staff, students and parents/caregivers, and the community.

2021-2022 Program Priorities Funding (PPF) -Parent Reaching Out Grant (PROG) Reallocation

For the 2021-2022 school year, TDSB has received an allocation of \$253,125.14 for projects that demonstrate a commitment to respecting the role of parents/caregivers in students' educational experiences. This year's allocation supported an array of initiatives including:

- School Council Anti-Black, Anti-Indigenous, and Oppression Grant (\$170,000)
- Parents Caregivers as Partners Conference (\$10,000+15,000=25,000)
- Virtual Engagement Tools (\$13,125.14 + 10,000-reallocation =\$23, 125)
- Central Administrative Expenses (\$25,000.00)

TDSBs business unit followed up with the Ministry of Education since the April report and was advised that Boards may allocate \$25,000 to support staffing costs. Hence the \$25,000 will be allocated to provide staffing support for the School Council Grants program. Any unspent funds will be reallocated to support the enhancement of Virtual Engagement tools (1-Webinar 500, 1000, 3000, and one 1000 meeting), expenses for the Parents Caregivers as Partners Conference, and interpretation and translation service.

School Council Parent Reaching Out Grants Update

School Councils are in the final stages of the grant. All have received a communication for the final report that is due on June 25, 2022. All unspent funds will be recalled from the school.
