Interim Expectations for Parent/Family Engagement in the School Improvement Process (SIP)

At its meeting on June 30, 2021, the Board approved the extension of the 2019-2020 interim expectations for parent/caregiver involvement in the SIP to 2021-2022 with the addition of data sharing with parents and caregivers.

The 2021-2022 proposed interim expectations for school teams will focus on explaining the SIP and the value of parent/caregiver engagement. Principals will seek input on the initial thinking regarding SIP goals with the School Council (as required under Regulation 612) and from all parents and caregivers, particularly those, under-represented and underserved, share school data with parents/caregivers on (well-being, equity, and

Schools will be commencing SIP work in the areas of achievement, equity, well-being, and Indigenous Education and Sovereignty. As part of their ongoing learning, we are currently working with our Superintendents on how to incorporate parent/caregiver engagement into the SIP with more coherence across the district.

Thank you to the PIAC members who met with the PCEO over the summer to review existing and new SIP tools for engaging parents/caregivers. The tools will be shared with PIAC, School Councils, Superintendents, and Principals.

PIAC's Quick Guide "Fall Tips for Principals" & School Council Outreach Plan

At its meeting on June 19, 2019, the Board approved the distribution of PIACs fall Tips for Principals and School Council Outreach Plan to the Superintendents. The information will be shared with Superintendents for communication with principals. The School Council Outreach Plan will also be shared.

2021-2022 Program Priorities Funding (PPF)

TDSB has received an allocation of \$ 264, 000 (\$10,000 more than last year) for the 2022-2023 school year for projects that demonstrate a commitment to respecting the role of parents/caregivers in students' educational experiences. This year's allocation will support an array of areas following consultation with PIAC, SEAC, and the Urban Indigenous Community Advisory Committee (UICAC).

School Council By Law Template

TDSB has updated the School Council By-Laws Template. The update includes:

- Mandatory articles that must be inserted into all TDSB School Council By-Laws:
- Optional articles that School Councils may or may not choose to insert;
- A template system that will enable School Councils to input their information and to have the By-Laws returned within 1-2 business days.

All Councils will be required to update or create by-laws by December 2022. The template will be shared with schools and Councils on September 30, 2022.
