Reading in the TDSB	Senior staff presented on French and English literacy supports and the board's Multi Years Strategy Plan Goals in Literacy to the committee.		
	Feedback/Discussion Sharing school library cards with parents enables families to participate in the reading program.		
	The tier three reading interventions should be made available to all schools.		
	Staff responded that the reading intervention program is provided at schools prioritized based on need. The program is done in partnership with sick kids that can support a certain number of schools each year. The Board is working on getting the tier three intervention for all schools.		
	The land acknowledgement was done in French and English at this meeting, Canada is a bilingual country. Why can't schools do the land acknowledgement in both official languages English and French? Staff responded that the decision to do		

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	land acknowledgement in both languages is a local school decision.  The Epic Website-was suggested as a great resource for learning to staff.		
Senior Staff Update	Reorganization of staff Majority of students are learning in person and learning also continues in smaller numbers for virtual learning. Enrolment numbers have increased more than projections.  Staff Vacancies  Hiring of staff is ongoing The number of LTO staff remain the same in schools The number of emergency replacement staff have decreased  Emergency replacement staff This staff group was used during COVID and previously. The process for hiring Emergency replacement persons for secondary is by the recommendation of the principals and through an online application process.  For elementary the application will require two references, one of them must be from a TDSB elementary principal and the other from a different staff member with whom the person has volunteered or worked with and would be in good standing and known to the principal at the school. ERP come with variety of skills as identified by the principal or staff that could serve students in the case of an emergency or provide supports for a		

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	short term. Staff can follow up on the present vetting process or provide more guidelines on having ERP staff at schools.
