






## TDSB Jewish Heritage Committee (JHC)

## Leaders of Change

- Because of our commitment to Liberation 75, and our personal experiences, we applied for, and were accepted as part of the Canadian Society for Yad Vashem (CSYV) Scholarship Program (fully-funded), 'Leaders of Change' joining leaders in education from across Canada to Berlin and Poland to interact with European Holocaust history in a personal, intense and experiential way
- Our goal through our students to help build a more humane world





#### The Holocaust

- The Holocaust began with Hitler's rise to power in January, 1933 and ended May 8,1945 on VE Day (Victory in Europe) when the Allies of World War II formally accepted Nazi Germany's unconditional surrender
- During this time over 6 million Jews and millions of others (including Soviet prisoners of war, political prisoners, Polish people, people with disabilities, homosexuals, Sinti and Roma, Jehovah's Witnesses, Catholic Clergy, Eastern European intellectuals) were murdered by the Nazi's
- During this period over 5,000 Jewish communities were wiped out and 2 out of every 3 European Jews were killed
- Prior to the Holocaust there were 18M Jews world-wide; estimates of the current world Jewish population is 13M

It is true that not all the victims were Jews, but all the Jews were victims










## Bełżec Killing Centre



This plaque, with instructions for the arriving victims, hung at the Befzec camp. Jan Glab, a local resident, discovered it right after the war. Attention! **Undress** completely! You will leave all the items brought with you in the designated area, with the exception of currency, valuables, documents, and shoes. You ought to keep currency, valuables, and documents with you until their collection at the designated window; do not let them out of your hands. Shoes should be tied in pairs and deposited in the designated area. You will approach bathing and inhalation completely undressed. roum Regionalne im. Janusza Petera, Tomaszów Lubelski










# From all over Europe – Murdered at Auschwitz



KL AUSCHWITZ WAS THE LARGEST NAZI GERMAN CONCENTRATION CAMP
AND SINCE 1942 ALSO MASS EXTERMINATION CENTRE FOR JEWS.
IN THE YEARS 1940-1945, THE NAZIS DEPORTED AT LEAST
1,300,000 PEOPLE TO AUSCHWITZ:
1,100,000 JEWS,
140,000-150,000 POLES,
23,000 ROMA /GYPSIES/,
15,000 SOVIET PRISONERS OF WAR,
25,000 PRISONERS FROM OTHER ETHNIC GROUPS.
2,100,000 OF THESE PEOPLE DIED IN AUSCHWITZ. APPROXIMATELY
90% OF THE VICTIMS WERE JEWS. THE SS MURDERED THE MAJORITY
90% OF THE VICTIMS WERE JEWS.

# Universality of "Hate"

- Hate speech has been normalized rhetoric used by those in power contributes to the growing climate of resentment and hatred of the 'other', the 'outsider', the 'stranger'... we have been here before
- Antidote human kindness, empathy, compassion
- The importance of the "**upstander**" as opposed to the "bystander" an upstander is defined as someone who recognizes when something is wrong and acts to make it right.

# Signs of Antisemitism... Everywhere





- Rise of antisemitic incidents in Europe and at home
- According to the most recent B'Nai Brith's Annual Audit of Antisemitic Incidents, 2018 saw a 16.5% increase with 2,041 recorded incidents compared to 1,752 incidents in 2017
- "No human race is superior; no religious faith is inferior. All collective judgments are wrong. Only racists make them." Elie Wiesel

### The Need for Holocaust Education

- 1 in 5 young Canadians either hasn't heard of the Holocaust or isn't sure what it was
- 2/3 of those surveyed either didn't know how many Jews were murdered or greatly underestimated the number
- Nearly 1/2 of the respondents could not name a single concentration camp
- Few Canadians believe there are many neo-Nazis in Canada today
- But... 82% of respondents believe all students should learn about the Holocaust in school, while 85% said it is important to keep teaching about the Holocaust so that it does not happen again.

"I swore never to be silent whenever and wherever human beings endure suffering and humiliation. We must always take sides.

Neutrality helps the oppressor, never the victim. Silence encourages the tormentor, never the tormented. Sometimes we must interfere. When human lives are endangered, when human dignity is in jeopardy, national borders and sensitivities become irrelevant.

Wherever men and women are persecuted because of their race, religion, or political views, that place must - at that moment - become the center of the universe."

## Hope... not just death

- Graphically recounting the Holocaust's horrors stories of gas chambers, crematoriums, death camps, sadistic SS guards, mass graves — is not the only way to honor the dead and educate the living...
- "You cannot just say one way. You have to mention the horrors and you also have to point out the people among us who could not be destroyed. We maintained our humane feelings and our desire to help others." - Arthur B. Shostak, a retired sociologist from Philadelphia's Drexel University who advices curators




# Middle School Literacy Project: "Hana's Suitcase"
